## Why Payment Systems Matter

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Cash flow is king in real estate. But cash flow only works if you actually collect the rent. The best property in the world is worthless if tenants don't pay.

Your payment system should accomplish three things:

1. **Make it easy to pay** — Remove friction, offer multiple options
2. **Make it automatic** — Recurring payments mean less chasing
3. **Make it trackable** — Know instantly who paid and who didn't

## Payment System

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If you're using PadSplit, payment collection is largely handled for you:

## How PadSplit Payments Work

- **Weekly payments:** Members pay every week (better cash flow, lower default risk)
- **Automatic collection:** Members set up payment method on file; charged automatically
- **Instant notifications:** You're notified of successful payments and failures
- **Direct deposit:** Funds deposited to your bank account weekly
- **Late fee handling:** PadSplit charges late fees and manages collections

## Your Responsibilities

- Ensure your bank account info is correct
- Monitor the dashboard for payment issues
- Respond to PadSplit if they escalate a non-payment situation

### **PADSPLIT PAYMENT TIP**

Weekly payments mean smaller amounts are easier for tenants to manage. A \$650/month room is ~\$162/week—much more manageable for hourly workers who get paid weekly or bi-weekly.

## Payment Setup

### Recommended Payment Stack

TOOL	BEST FOR	FEES	PROS/CONS
<b>Zelle</b>	Primary collection	Free	Instant, no fees, most banks support it
<b>Venmo</b>	Backup option	Free for bank transfer	Popular with younger tenants
<b>Cash App</b>	Backup option	Free for bank transfer	Easy to use, instant transfers
<b>RentRedi</b>	Full automation	\$12/mo or free w/ paid plan	Auto-reminders, tracking, reporting
<b>Avail</b>	Full automation	Free tier available	Integrated with screening/leases

### Setting Up Your System

1. **Primary method:** Set up Zelle with your dedicated rental bank account
2. **Backup method:** Create Venmo or Cash App account for tenants who prefer it
3. **Tracking:** Use a spreadsheet or RentRedi to track all payments
4. **Reminders:** Set up automated reminders (RentRedi) or manual calendar alerts

## Weekly vs. Monthly Payments

### Weekly Payments

- Smaller amounts = easier for tenants
- Faster detection of payment issues
- Better cash flow alignment
- More administrative work

**Best for:** Hourly workers, lower-income tenants

### Monthly Payments

- Less frequent tracking
- Simpler accounting
- Standard expectation
- Higher default risk if tenant loses job

**Best for:** Salaried professionals, stable tenants

## Handling Late Payments

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### Prevention First

- Screen for income (2.5x rent minimum)
- Set clear expectations at move-in
- Send reminders 2-3 days before due date
- Make paying easy (multiple options)

## When Payments Are Late

### Day 1-3: Friendly Reminder

"Hi [Name], just a reminder that rent was due on [date]. Please send payment today to avoid a late fee. Let me know if you have any questions!"

### Day 4-5: Late Fee Notice

"Hi [Name], your rent payment is now [X] days past due. Per your lease, a \$[X] late fee has been applied. Total due is now \$[X]. Please pay immediately to avoid further action."

### Day 6+: Formal Notice

Issue a formal "Pay or Quit" notice per your state's requirements. This starts the legal clock for eviction if needed.

#### **KNOW YOUR STATE LAWS**

Eviction timelines and notice requirements vary by state. In Georgia, you can issue a demand for possession after rent is late and proceed to court if unpaid. Research your state's specific requirements.

## Action Steps

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1. **If using PadSplit:** Verify your bank account info and understand the payment timeline
2. **If self-managing:** Set up Zelle and one backup payment method

4. **Create a payment tracking system** (spreadsheet or software)
5. **Draft your late payment policy** and include it in your lease
